## Whitewebbs Park

Renaturing, rewilding, call it what you will.

Since the golf course closed in 2021 the open area of the park has been left to look after itself. As you walk over it take a close look at the huge variety of grasses, wildflowers, insects and butterflies that inhabit the open areas. In just three years nature has taken over at an exponential rate.

Look at the sand bunkers and try counting the hundreds, if not thousands of healthy young trees thriving in this beautiful landscape.

The old meadow areas (A and B) have been left alone for the last 10 – 15 years. See how nature has refashioned this rough grassland with a mix of trees, shrubs, grasses and flowers.
